The online cohort will meet via live weekly video meetings over Zoom; there will be no in-person meetings.

Summer Independent Study Time

One month of independent study time between the final summer meeting and the start of the fall cohort meetings (August 20-September 17); this time is to be used for independent writing time, focusing on aspects of craft your teaching mentor feels will help your development as a writer; deep reading, of your own work as well as books outside of the cohort reading list that will benefit your writing; one to one meetings with your teaching mentor; writing group meetings with your cohort members.

Manuscript Consultations and Final

Each student will also meet one-on-one with the project leader four times over the course of the year-long program. These meetings include one introductory meeting before the program kicks off on June 11, 2025, and one manuscript consultation session after April 1, 2026 when the program concludes (and by which date you need to have submitted your final manuscript, double-spaced, 1" margin, 12 point font pages—no pdfs, please—either Word or Google docs so I can give feedback electronically), to be completed no later than June 23, 2026.

Course description

The 2025 Poetry Apprenticeship Summer Program is a mixture of one-on-one time with Danez Smith, and time spent with your full poetry cohort in peer activities.

Your one-on-one sessions will be tailored specifically to you and your goals. The primary reading for these sessions will be your poetry. One-on-one time will revolve around your goals for your poetry as well as considering suggested edits to your work. During these sessions, Danez will provide intensive craft instruction and feedback, but you will also be able to ask questions and discuss concerns.

Your cohort time will be either formal presentation (by Danez) or group activity and discussion, depending on the week. During the winter and fall terms, Danez will lead cohort time two weeks of the month, providing focused talks or guiding the group through response to poetry collections, podcasts, articles on craft or on the writing life, organizing manuscripts, and more. Brief guided exercises and generative writing will be incorporated into these sessions.

Danez's presentation topics will include craft concerns (such as titles, line breaks, crafting poem series, and use of poetic forms), the discussion of essays by poets from the book *Personal Best: Makers on Their Poems that Matter Most* edited by Erin Belieu and Carl Philips, as well as topics such the personal and the political in poetry, the use of language other than English in poems, and an examination of what makes a poem or collection of poems ready to submit for publication. Presentations will be tailored to the group needs, once Danez meets everyone in January, and as the year progresses.

During the other two weeks of the month in winter and fall terms, you will meet with Danez one-on-one on a day to be determined according to your schedules. We will decide as a group how we would like to spend our time together during one-on-one weeks. Cohorts can devote time to sharing work with one another in a workshop format and also in discussions of our brief reading assignments. In the past, cohorts have taken turns bringing prompts and writing together. During one-on-one weeks, we might adjust our schedule to attend online poetry presentations or have a shorter session in order to do so. What we do with our time in one-on-one weeks will evolve with our work and is likely to become a time for peer workshop and peer learning, an important aspect of the writer's life that creates community support and audience.

Please see below for a week by week proposed schedule. This document is subject to change, however Wednesdays in the p.m. will be our core meeting time.

All specific lectures and assigned readings will be tailored to individuals and to the cohort, once Danez has gotten a feel for what you want and need in 2025. **Detailed syllabi will be provided each term**—what you'll find below is a proposed schedule to be discussed in our first weeks.

Note: All weeks run Saturday to Friday, though most activities and meetings will take place during the week. Occasionally, a visiting writer or publishing professional might need to meet on a weekend, so for consistency's sake, you'll see the weeks organized with weekends involved.
