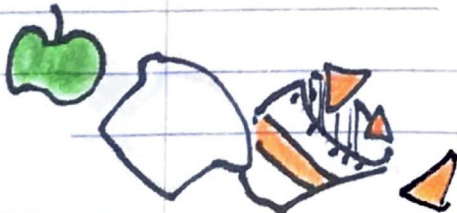
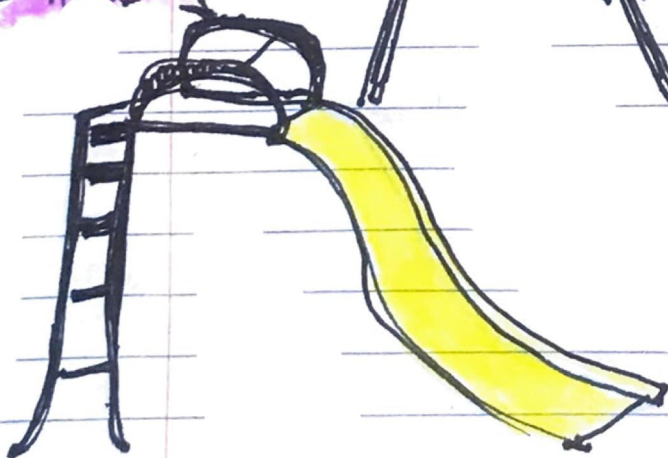
Draw another animal in this picture. What would
